The Kitimat CDC offers the following services: Unless noted, referrals to programs can be self-referral or community referrals from doctors, school, social workers, public health nurses, etc.

Healthy Babies (HB)- For individuals/families provides support through pregnancy through first year of parenting. Drop in is every Thursday from 10:30 am -12:00pm.

Building Blocks (BB) - Support for parents who require assistance to meet the needs of their children from birth to five years. Mon 10am-12pm, Wed & Fri 1-3pm

Infant Development Program (IDP)- For children ages birth to 3 years who require developmental support. Drop In group - Tuesdays 10:30 am—12:00 pm

Supported Child Development (SCD)— Provides support to children who require extra support within the family's choice of childcare or community program.

Family Support Program (FS) – Provides support for families with children 0- 18 years who are accessing early intervention of school-aged services.

Speech-Language Pathology (SLP) – Provides support to children with communication difficulties aged 0-6.

Physiotherapy (PT)- Provides intervention and support regarding gross motor for children 0-18 years

Occupational Therapy (OT)- Provides intervention and support for children 0-18 to participation in self-care, productivity and leisure activities at home and in the community.

Community Link - Provides in-school emotional and social support for kids 4-18 years.

Kitimat Housing Resource Program - Provides support for homeless persons and those at risk of homelessness.

Poverty Law Advocate – Assist individuals with income assistance, disability assistance, tenancy disputes, Canada Pension Plan Disability benefits, employment insurance benefits, debt, and other income support related programs. Drop in at Cornerstone office every Wednesday 1-3pm and Friday 10am-12pm

Autism Behavioural Services (ABS)- Provides consultation and intervention for families with children on the autism spectrum. This is a fee for service program.

Better at Home Program - Program is help seniors remain independent at home. <u>This is a fee for service</u> program based on a sliding scale.

Preschool Program - For children 3 to 5 years <u>This is</u> a fee for service program.

Stepping Stones Daycare - For children aged 0-5. This is a fee for service program.

Out of School Care – Before and after care for school-aged children at Kildala School. <u>This is a fee</u> for service program.

Prenatal Classes - This is a fee for service class.

Referrals only accepted from Ministry of Children and Family Development:

Social & Emotional Wellness (SEW)- Provides mental health support to children age 5 to 18. Referrals from Child and Youth Mental Health Clinician.

Parent Support (PS) – Parents with children 0-18 years on Child and Youth Special Needs program.

Child and Youth Worker Program - Provides support and direct goal-oriented assistance to individual children and their families

Family Preservation Program - To support and help incorporate healthy lifestyle changes within the home setting.

Youth Transitions - Individual and/or group interventions that focus transitioning to adulthood.
